



Getting to Manhattan from the Airport

JFK -

- Cab (\$50+)
- Airtrain (\$15+)
- Super Shuttle (\$20+ p/person)
- Bus (varies)

Laguardia -

- Cab (\$35+)
- Super Shuttle (\$20+ p/person)
- Bus (varies)

Newark -

- Cab (\$75)
- Airport Express (\$15+)
- Airtrain (\$18+)

Transportation

- The entire city is very walkable, but if you need to get from one end of town to the other a cab or the subway is a great option. If it's raining, find the most direct route to the subway as it will be hard to hail a cab.
- Download a subway app (HopStop is a good option). It will quickly become your best friend as you make your way around the city. The subway is safe, but I wouldn't go by yourself late at night. Wear layers, it can get really hot underground and depending where you're going you could be down there for 20-30 minutes. The weekend schedule is unpredictable for a lot of the trains, so listen to the announcements carefully or ask for assistance.
- Buying a Metro Card - You can purchase an unlimited day pass, unlimited week pass, or just put a bulk amount on your card and use it as you go
- In addition to taxi cabs, Uber can be helpful to get around.
- Renting a citibike is a fun option and they are inexpensive, parked all over the city, and available 24/7.
