

# Neighborhood Guide

Each New York neighborhood has its own character, style, and personality. It's fun to explore them all and get a taste of what this city has to offer.

- **The Financial District** - 9/11 Memorial, Ferry to Statue of Liberty, busy bankers and lawyers as well as interesting architecture
- **Lower East Side** - Katz's Deli, galleries, restaurants, live music and late night bars
- **Little Italy and Chinatown** - Neighborhoods that celebrate Italian and Chinese heritage and food (located in lower Manhattan)
- **SoHo, Nolita and Tribeca** - wide cobblestone streets, historical cast-iron buildings, boutique shopping, cute cafes, and celebrity spotting
- **The Village** - Neighborhood feel, great restaurants, Friends apartment (on the corner of Grove and Bedford above Little Owl)
- **Chelsea and Meatpacking District** - The Highline, Chelsea market, expensive condos, designer shopping, happening nightlife
- **Midtown and Times Square** - People watching, crowds, the theater district
- **Union Square and Flatiron District** - iconic wedge-shaped Flatiron building, original Shake Shack in Madison Square Park, seasonal art installations, NYU students
- **Upper West & Upper East Side** - Museums, Central Park, shopping on Madison Ave and 5<sup>th</sup> Ave.
- **Bronx** - Yankees Stadium
- **Brooklyn Bridge and DUMBO** - dramatic views of Manhattan, walk or bike ride on the Bridge, Brooklyn style pizza, and hipsters
